6. ANSI 107-2004 Class III clothing (or greater) is required of all workers within the right-of-way.
7. All riders must ride no more than two abreast and must not impede traffic if doing so.
8. Applicant certifies that all participants have signed a Waiver and Release of Damages against the State of Utah for participation in an approved special event on State Roads.
9. Bikers are expected to wear reflective clothing when riding at night. Bicyclists must be equipped with a white light on the front and a red reflector on the back of their bike.
10. Licensee will be responsible to clean up the highway after the event.
11. In Utah, a bicycle is considered a vehicle and must abide by the same rules of the road.
12. Snell, ANSI, or ASTM approved helmets must be worn by all participants.
13. Spectators must be kept a safe distance from the participants to view this event.
